



## BUILDING ENTRY TRAINING FOR NARCOTICS DETECTIVES

### Course Description:

This is a 40 hour course focusing on the basic techniques of building entries, immediate action drills, care under fire, UC/CS Rescue,

This course is designed for drug units of all sizes, gang units, and small pro-act teams that frequently conduct operations involving the service of search warrants, the use of confidential sources, and vehicle take-downs.

This is a **newly designed course in 2017** that is for all skill levels. New and experienced officers and detectives are encouraged to attend.
